

# ASEM-DUO WALLONIA-BRUSSELS FELLOWSHIP



#### 01. PURPOSE OF THE ASEM-DUO PROGRAMME

# 01.1 / THE ACADEMY FOR RESEARCH AND HIGHER EDUCATION AND INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

The Academy for research and higher education (*Académie de recherche et d'enseignement supérieur* – ARES) is the federation of higher education institutions (HEIs) in the Wallonia-Brussels Federation (FWB), the French-speaking Community of Belgium. As a public interest body, it is responsible for supporting institutions in their teaching, research and community service missions. It brings together 6 universities, 19 university colleges, 16 colleges of arts and 86 adult education colleges, it organises the dialogue and promotes their cooperation nationally and internationally.

As a unique platform, ARES ensures global coordination for the higher education sector in the Wallonia-Brussels Federation.

ARES is the designated administrative body in charge of the implementation of the ASEM-DUO Fellowship Programme in the Wallonia-Brussels Federation, in collaboration with the ASEM-DUO Secretariat based in Seoul. It is responsible for every aspect of the administrative management of the programme including : the publication of the call for applications, the receipt of applications, the selection of the applicants, the production of all the documents related to the fellowship, the payment of grants, the receipt of the mission reports.

#### 01.2/ THE ASEM-DUO PROGRAMME

A specific cooperation process between Asia and Europe in the field of education – and more specifically higher education – has been set up in the context of the Asia-Europe Meeting. The ministerial meetings, which are held alternatively in Europe and Asia, are until now the sole instrument for cooperation at a higher political level between the two continents. This mode of functioning inspires itself of the experience and best practices of the Bologna Process. During the Asia-Europe Meeting of Ministers of Education held in Kuala Lumpur in 2013, the Wallonia-Brussels Federation announced it would participate in the ASEM-DUO Fellowship Programme as of 2014.

Generally, the ASEM-DUO Fellowship Programme (dating from 2001) aims at:

- » Promoting balanced mobility of higher education students and professors between the two regions,
- » Setting up regular exchange programmes between HEIs,
- » Reinforcing cooperation and dialogue across both regions.

ASEM-DUO is composed of sub-programmes through which the States offer "paired exchanges" for students or professors between partner institutions, one European and the other Asian.

DUO Wallonia-Brussels has been established at the Wallonia-Brussels Federation in order to promote "paired exchanges" between professors and researchers from Wallonia-Brussels HEIs and Asian ones. The list of partner countries is: Australia, Bangladesh, Brunei, Cambodia, China, India, Indonesia, Japan, Kazakhstan, South Korea, Laos, Malaysia, Mongolia, Myanmar, New Zealand, Pakistan, Philippines, Russia, Singapore, Taiwan, Thailand, and Vietnam.

#### 02. 2.2 / CONDITIONS OF USE OF THE GRANT

- » The grant is intended to cover international travel expenses and per diem capped at the amount of the grant;
- » The exchange is done by pairs: the beneficiary from the Wallonia-Brussels HEI is hosted by the Asian institution, and vice-versa;
- » Mobilities shall start no earlier than August 1st, 2023 and shall end no later than August 31st, 2024;
- » The total duration of each person's stay is fixed at a minimum of 21 days and a maximum of 60 days (including travel days). This period may be divided into two stays;
- » No later than 2 months after their final return date, the beneficiaries undertake to send back a report of their stay in PDF format using a form that will be sent to them at the same time as the agreement. This report will describe the results of the project in the target country, according to the following structure:
  - » A summary of the project (10 lines),
  - » The actions/research carried out during the visit and the results obtained,
  - » The course of the visit,
  - » The impact of your visit on your institution,
  - » The contribution of the ASEM-DUO programme to this particular project.
  - » Positive points and improvements to be made to the ASEM-DUO programme.

#### 02. 2.3 / TERMS OF PAYMENT

- » ARES will proceed with the purchase of international transport tickets (flight or train tickets in economy class) according to the dates communicated in the flight preference form, sending a minimum of 3 options to each beneficiary beforehand;
- » In the exceptional event that one or the other beneficiary wishes to purchase his/her own transport tickets (air or train tickets), he/she shall inform ARES via the flight preference form and provide a copy of the transport tickets that he/she paid. The beneficiary who makes use of this possibility accepts that this personal purchase will not be reimbursed later by ARES and that the grant awarded will therefore correspond exclusively to the amount of the daily allowances (per diem);
- After the cost of the international transport tickets has been deducted from the individual grant, ARES undertakes to pay the amount of the per diem capped at the amount of the grant in two instalments to each beneficiary into the bank account indicated in the agreement. Before the payment of the first instalment of the per diem, ARES will send a pre-filled form containing the beneficiary's bank details and the amount to be paid; this is a declaration of claim. The beneficiary will have to check, sign and return this document to ARES before his/her departure. In the event that the beneficiary makes two trips, the statement of claim will only be sent by ARES to the beneficiary for the second trip. The amount of the per diem varies from one country to another and is listed in the table<sup>2</sup> below:

- » Applications must be submitted between February 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023 and March 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023. No applications will be accepted before February 1<sup>st</sup> or after March 30<sup>th</sup> 2023;
- » An applicant can submit several files, with different partners. In this case, a maximum of one file per applicant could be selected, as to know, the one obtaining the highest score from the jury :
- » A duo may apply a maximum of twice for the same project and may receive ASEM-DUO FWB funding a maximum of once for the same project;
- » An acknowledgement of receipt is sent to the applicants within 3 days after the reception of the application. Without any response after that time, please contact <a href="mailto:international@ares-ac.be">international@ares-ac.be</a>.

#### 02.4/ SELECTION

#### 02. 4.1/ SELECTION CRITERIA

ARES selects beneficiaries of the ASEM-DUO Wallonia Brussels Fellowship Programme based on the following criteria:

- » The scientific, academic or artistic quality of the submitted project;
- » The originality of the project;
- » The scientific, academic or artistic quality of the applicants (e.g. publications, publications with the partner institution, research or artistic project, exhibitions, work experience, competitions, academic background, etc.);
- » The expected impact of the grant on the work and professional career of the applicant:
- » The expected impact of the grant on the applicant's institution;
- » The explanation for the duration of the trip;
- » The quality of bilateral relations between the Wallonia-Brussels institution and the Asian partner:
- » The relevance of financial support for the applicants :
- » The complementarity of the projects submitted between the members of the duo (if the projects are different).

#### 02. 4.2 / JURY AND SELECTION PROCEDURE

The administrative eligibility of applications is examined by the International Relations Department (DRI) of ARES. Admissible applications are presented to a jury responsible for analysing and evaluating them with a view to selecting the beneficiaries. This jury is composed of 6 university representatives, one from each university of the FWB, 2 representatives of university colleges and 1 representative of art colleges.

Admissible applications are evaluated by the selection panel on the basis of a score from 0 to 5 per criterion (0 being the least satisfactory and 5 the most satisfactory). On the basis of the scores obtained and the available budget, the jury proceeds to the ranking and selection of the applicants.

Finally, the candidates will be informed of the results of the selection and will be invited to sign a tripartite agreement binding themselves and ARES.

Parliament European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data and the free movement of such data (GDPR).

Beneficiaries also have the following rights:

- » The right to information
- » The right of access to the data,
- » The right of rectification,
- » The right to erase data (if and only if the data are no longer useful to ensure adequate treatment of the file).

#### 02.9 / Breach of obligations

In the event of non-compliance by the beneficiaries of the ASEM-DUO grant with the obligations laid down in these rules and in the agreement, ARES reserves the right to demand the total or partial reimbursement of the sums already paid.

ARES also reserves the right to claim damages from the beneficiaries in the event of prejudice, in particular linked to the total or partial non-fulfilment of the obligations set out in this Regulation and in the agreement or in the event of damage to the image of ARES. For example, if one of the partners of the duo is unable to complete his or her stay for reasons that do not fall within the scope of force majeure (see below) and therefore does not respect the condition of reciprocity of the mobilities, he or she will have to reimburse the totality of the expenses incurred by ARES for him or her and his or her partner within the framework of the ASEM-DUO programme (cost of transport tickets and per diem already paid).

#### 02.10 / FORCE MAJEURE

The Party affected by a case of force majeure, making it impossible to comply with one or more of its obligations under this Regulation and the Agreement shall immediately notify the other two Parties. A case of "force majeure" is defined by its irresistible, unforeseeable and independent nature.

That Party shall make every effort, in agreement with the other two Parties, to reduce as far as possible the harmful effects/damage resulting from this situation.

ARES reserves the right to verify and control the reality of the facts with the party that considers itself to be affected by the case of force majeure. If the ARES legal department confirms the case of force majeure, the party claiming force majeure is temporarily released from its obligations. In agreement with the other two parties, the party affected by the case of force majeure will, in the end, make every effort to find or propose alternatives so that the obligations contained in these rules and in the agreement can be fulfilled.

#### 02.11 / COMPETENT COURTS

Any dispute regarding the execution of this agreement is the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of the judicial district of Brussels.
