In accordance with the pertinent provisions of Republic Act (RA) No. 7722, otherwise known as the "Higher Education Act of 1994", and in relation with the relevant safeguards provided under RA 11862, "Expanded Anti-Trafficking in Persons Act of 2022" and its implementing rules and regulations, which amended RA 9208("Anti-Trafficking in Persons Act of 2023"), and RA 10362 ("Expanded Anti-trafficking in Persons Act of 2012); RA 7610, "Special Protection of Children Against Abuse, Exploitation and Discrimination Act; RA 8042, "Migrant Worker and Overseas Filipino Act of 1995" and its amendatory laws and omnibus rules and regulations; RA 11641," Department of Migrant Workers Act and other relevant laws; and pursuant to the Commission en Banc (CEB) Resolution No. 331-2023, dated June 6, 2023, the Commission on Higher Education Regional Office 2 hereby disseminates a copy of the CHED Memorandum Order No. 10, series of 2023, "Enhanced Policies, Standards and Guidelines (PSGs) on Student Internship Abroad Program (SIAP)", for information and guidance.

All Public and Private Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) in Region 2 which intends to participate in SIAP are advised to apply in accordance with Section 8.1 of the abovementioned CMO at least one (1) semester prior to the intended deployment of students. Only HEIs included in the list of participating HEIs for SIAP with complete and compliant documents as provided for in Section 8.2 of the said CMO shall be forwarded to the CHED Central Office for endorsement to the Bureau of Immigration (BI).

Wide dissemination of this memorandum is desired.

SUBJECT: ENHANCED POLICIES, STANDARDS AND GUIDELINES (PSGs) ON STUDENT INTERNSHIP ABROAD PROGRAM (SIAP)

In accordance with the pertinent provisions of Republic Act (RA) 7722, otherwise known as the "Higher Education Act of 1994", and in relation with the relevant safeguards provided under RA 11862, otherwise known as the "Expanded Anti-Trafficking in Persons Act of 2022" and its implementing rules and regulations, which amended RA 9208 ("Anti-Trafficking in Persons Act of 2023"), and RA 10362 ("Expanded Anti-trafficking in Persons Act of 2012); RA 7610, otherwise known as Special Protection of Children Against Abuse, Exploitation and Discrimination Act; RA 8042, otherwise known as "Migrant Worker and Overseas Filipinos Act of 1995" and its amendatory laws and omnibus rules and regulations; RA 11641, otherwise known as the "Department of Migrant Workers Act" and other relevant laws; and pursuant to the Commission en Banc (CEB) Resolution No. 331-2023, dated June 6, 2023, the following policies, standards, and guidelines for student internship abroad program for all Commission on Higher Education (CHED) recognized programs with internship/OJT/practicum subjects are hereby adopted for the information, guidance, and compliance of all concerned.

## Article I GUIDING PRINCIPLES

- Section 1. The CHED is mandated to develop and promote programs, policies, systems, and procedures that address globalization, changing foreign policies, and liberalization of trade in goods and services relevant to higher education. As such, CHED encourages and promotes strong academic linkage with businesses and industries abroad for cross-cultural training and skills enhancement to make students competitive for employment in the Philippines and abroad.
- Section 2. The implementation of programs particularly the sending of Filipino tertiary students<sup>1</sup> for training and internship abroad requires that CHED and partner agencies adopt measures to ensure the safety and well-being of these students while providing them with applied learning opportunities and cross-cultural training and skills enhancement in reputable companies and training institutions in various parts of the world.

Section 3. In recognition of their respective existing international linkages and networking, the CHED issues this enhanced policies, standards, and guidelines on SIAP for students enrolled in public and private Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) with established Internship Abroad Program.

## Article II DEFINITION OF TERMS

This definition of terms shall apply to this CMO:

- Foreign Host Establishments or Organizations (FHEs/Os) refer to training venues for student interns duly recognized and registered entities in the country of destination.
- 2. Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) refer to educational institutions, private or public, undertaking operations of higher education program/s with an organized group of students pursuing defined studies in higher education, receiving instructions from teachers, usually located in a building or group of buildings in a particular site specifically intended for educational purposes.

For purposes of this CMO, HEIs with any of the following classifications may implement SIAP:

- 2.1 Autonomous HEIs refer to private HEIs that demonstrate exceptional institutional quality and enhancement through internal QA systems, and demonstrate excellent program outcomes through a high proportion of accredited programs, the presence of Centers of Excellence, and/or Development and/or international certification. In particular, they show evidence of outstanding performance consistent with their horizontal type, e.g., research and publications for universities; creative work and relevant extension programs for colleges; and employability or linkages for professional institutes; and
- 2.2 Deregulated HEIs refer to private HEIs that demonstrate very good institutional quality and enhancement through internal QA systems, and very good program outcomes through a good proportion of accredited programs, the presence of Centers of Excellence and/or Development, and/or international certification.
- 3. Institutional Sustainability Assessment (ISA) refers to the CHED quality assurance process that assesses the institutional sustainability of an HEI in the key area of quality of teaching and learning as supported by governance and management; support for students; relations with the community; and quality of exposure, research and creative work.
- SUCs Level refers to the category of state universities and colleges as a result of the evaluation conducted by CHED.



 Higher Education Degree Program – refers to the specific courses of study in the higher level of the education system leading to a bachelor's, master's, or doctoral degree.

For purposes of this CMO, HEIs program offerings with any of the following designations may implement SIAP:

- 5.1 Center of Development (COD) refers to a designation granted by CHED in recognition of a unit's evident above-average performance in teaching, research, and extension functions; and
- 5.2 Center of Excellence (COE) refers to a designation granted by CHED in recognition of a unit's exemplary performance in its teaching, research, and extension functions.
- 6. Inter-Agency Council Against Trafficking (IACAT) refers to a body mandated by law to coordinate and monitor the implementation of Republic Act 9208 or the Anti-Trafficking in Persons Act of 2003 with the Department of Justice as the lead agency.
- 7. Internship/On-the-Job Training (OJT)/Practicum refers to the application of classroom learning to actual work such as but not limited to commercial and industrial services, government or non-government agencies on the field laboratory.
- 8. International Linkages a voluntary combination of Philippine and foreign institutions for the furtherance of objectives dictated by their mutual interest.
- 9. Foreign Service Post (FSP) refers to all Philippine embassies, missions, consulates general, and other foreign service establishments maintained by the Department of Foreign Affairs pursuant to RA 7157, otherwise known as the "Philippine Foreign Service Act of 1991".
- 10. Level of Program Accreditation refers to accreditation awarded by non-government accrediting bodies recognized by CHED to a particular program indicating that it has attained a certain standard of quality over and above the minimum requirements prescribed by CHED.
- 11. Student interns refer to Filipino students enrolled in CHED recognized programs or courses offered by HEIs and qualified to undergo SIAP as required by their programs/courses.

## Article III OBJECTIVES

#### Section 4. The Program aims to:

4.1 Provide tertiary students enrolled in HEIs implementing SIAP the opportunity to acquire practical knowledge, skills, and desirable attitudes

in recognized Foreign Host Establishments or Organizations (FHEs/Os) in foreign countries;

4.2 Enhance the students' work values, competencies, and discipline as they relate to others in a multicultural work environment:

4.3 Promote global competitiveness of students through their training, exposure, and acculturation in a foreign country;

4.4 Strengthen and enrich the degree programs in HEIs in order to deliver levels of knowledge and skills necessary in a dynamic competitive world; and

4.5 Protect and safeguard students undergoing internship abroad from harassment, exploitation, deplorable training conditions, and such other conditions that contravene or defeat the purpose of the internship.

## Article IV SCOPE AND COVERAGE

Section 5. The internship abroad program is voluntary in nature thus, students are given the option to render their internship/OJT/practicum locally or internationally.

All internships conducted abroad for purposes of completion of the academic degree shall be governed by this CMO, except internships in the agriculture program.

Only HEIs authorized to implement SIAP are allowed to conduct internship abroad for CHED recognized programs with internship/OJT/practicum subject or course in their curriculum.

For internship in agriculture program, the same shall be governed by another set of guidelines considering that the national government has prioritized agriculture activities.

Programs under the cultural exchanges, international linkages, and extension services are not covered by this CMO.

## Article V IMPLEMENTING GUIDELINES

## Section 6. Requirements for Parties Involved

- 6.1 Higher Education Institutions (HEIs)
  - 6.1.1 Must possess any of the following:
    - a. Autonomous or Deregulated for private HEIs;
    - b. SUC Level III or IV or V;
    - With programs identified as COE/COD or with accredited programs awarded by international accrediting bodies;



- d. With at least Level II Accreditation status of the program awarded by local accrediting bodies; or at least Level 1 but with Level II Accreditation status in the allied programs of the same cluster of discipline; and
- e. With an assessment average score of 3 in ISA but in no case no score below 3 in Key Results Area (KRA) 4.
- 6.1.2 Internship/OJT/practicum subject must form part of the requirements in the CHED duly noted/approved curriculum;
- 6.1.3 Must have a fully functional (i.e. operational manual, technical mechanism, unit organizational chart) internship unit/office with a designated permanent full-time staff to manage and monitor the effective operation of the program; and
- 6.1.4 Must have a system and processes for the implementation of the internship abroad program.

## 6.2 Foreign Host Establishments or Organizations (FHEs/Os)

- 6.2.1 Must be duly recognized, and registered in the country where the student will have his/her internship;
- 6.2.2 Must not fall under any of the following Establishments/ Organizations:
  - a. Those primarily engaged in the operation of (1) night clubs;
    (2) saunas; (3) military and/or law enforcement commissaries;
    (4) disco; (5) karaoke bars; (6) spa; (7) casinos, and the like;
  - Whose nature of business is hazardous to student interns as determined by the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE); and
  - c. Those which promote or facilitate child prostitution and other sexual abuse, child trafficking, obscene publications and indecent shows, and other acts of abuse per provision from R.A. 7610 and related laws.
- 6.2.3 Must have an appropriate internship program for the student interns based on the existing CHED guidelines; and
- 6.2.4 The country of origin of the FHE/O must be included on the list of countries with bilateral agreements on education between the Philippines and other countries.<sup>2</sup>
- **6.3 Student Interns** who must be carefully screened by the HEI, must possess the following minimum qualifications:
  - 6.3.1 Must be a Filipino citizen;
  - 6.3.2 Currently enrolled in the internship/OJT/practicum subject at the Philippine HEI and must have completed at least 75% of professional units for the particular program;
  - 6.3.3 At least 20 years old at the time of the internship;
  - 6.3.4 Passed the pre-practicum/internship requirements of the HEI;
  - 6.3.5 In good academic standing as certified by the HEI;

- 6.3.6 Physically, mentally, and emotionally fit and have passed the physical and psychological examinations as certified by Department of Health (DOH) accredited clinics and hospitals:
- 6.3.7 Articulate in English or in the language spoken in the host country; and
- 6.3.8 Has notarized affidavit of written consent from parents/legal guardian/spouse to undergo international internship.

## Section 7. Obligations/Responsibilities of Parties

### 7.1 Higher Education Institutions (HEIs)

- 7.1.1 Assume full responsibility over the students while having their internship abroad program including those with existing agreements with other groups/ entities to assist them in the implementation;
- 7.1.2 Develop, in collaboration with the duly selected FHEs/Os an Internship Plan³ for the student intern specifying among others the goals and objectives, student outcomes, knowledge, skills, and competencies that the student intern should acquire in each area of assignment, and schedule of activities. The internship plan shall be part of the Internship Contract to be signed by the student intern, the HEI, and FHEs/Os;
- 7.1.3 Designate a full-time SIAP Coordinator who shall be in charge of all aspects of the student internship programs including program implementation, monitoring, and evaluation but not limited to the following duties:
  - a. Monitors closely and contacts directly with the student interns while they participate in the international internship:
  - b. Communicates directly, with the DFA through the relevant FSP in case of emergency or situations requiring the intervention of the Philippine Embassy or Consulate; and
  - c. Notifies and provides regular updates to CHED and coordinates closely with the FHEs/Os regarding such emergency situations.
- 7.1.4 Prepare a Contingency Plan in coordination with the partner FHEs/Os which shall include timely coordination with the FSP in the host country, in case of emergency situations, to be submitted to CHED together with application documents;
- 7.1.5 Conduct an initial visit/inspection of their partner FHEs/Os and representative office to ensure the safety of student interns;
- 7.1.6 Document and submit inspection report indicating among others the accreditation and qualifications to DFA Consular Affairs through CHED of their partner FHEs/Os;
- 7.1.7 Prepare policies and procedures to handle the international internships including management response such as health emergencies, natural calamities and other similar events;
- 7.1.8 Pre-qualify student interns in accordance with the requirements from the receiving FHEs/Os;

- 7.1.9 Facilitate the processing of the documents on behalf of the student intern
- 7.1.10 Conduct of intensive pre-departure orientation to include the risks of exposure/travel due to the existing health situation, and the country of destination's protocol and requirements for qualified student interns in the presence of their parents/ legal guardians/spouse;
- 7.1.11 Provide disaster risk training management for student interns;
- 7.1.12 Ensure the registration of student interns at PSF in close coordination with the FHEs/Os;
- 7.1.13 Provide available immediate support to student interns, in case there is a delay on the claims on insurance;
- 7.1.14 Monitor and evaluate the performance and welfare of student interns and immediately attend to their complaints and grievances by coordinating with FHEs/Os, CHED, FSP, and other concerned government authorities:
- 7.1.15 Collate the monthly journal of experience;
- 7.1.16 Submit, in coordination with the FHEs/Os, the report of registration<sup>4</sup> to CHED-OSDS through the concerned CHED Regional Office (CHEDROs) within fifteen (15) days upon registration of student intern at the FSP;
- 7.1.17 Conduct debriefing and post evaluation of the student interns upon their return:
- 7.1.18 Impose disciplinary sanction on student interns found guilty of violating any of the provisions contained in this CMO;
- 7.1.19 Submit to concerned CHEDRO incidental report in case of critical incident while undergoing international internship;
- 7.1.20 Report any irregularities of the establishments or organizations or violations as provided in the guidelines of the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) and RA 7610 and RA 11930 to IACAT through CHED; and
- 7.1.21 Submit to the Office of Student Development and Services (OSDS) through the CHEDROs the required Annual report per Academic Year (AY) on the implementation of SIAP, in hard and electronic files, fifteen (15) days after the AY to include the following:
  - a. Executive Summary containing among others the strength of the program and areas of improvement;
  - b. Summary of student learning experiences;
  - c. List of students and their status (completed, ongoing, terminated for a cause):
  - d. Report on complaints and grievances of student interns or FHEs/Os, including the action taken to address such grievances, if any;
  - e. Report on disciplinary sanction of student interns found guilty of violating any of the provisions contained in this CMO, if any; and
  - f. Recommendations, if any.

7.2 Foreign Host Establishments or Organizations (FHEs/Os)

- 7.2.1 Develop, in collaboration with the HEIs an Internship Plan for the student intern specifying among others the goals and objectives, student outcomes, knowledge, skills, and competencies that the student intern should acquire in each area of assignment and schedule of activities. The internship plan shall be part of the Internship Contract to be signed by the student interns, the HEI, and FHEs/Os;
- 7.2.2 Present and register the student intern at the nearest FSP within a week upon arrival in the Host Country. Registration of student interns must include the following information:
  - a. Name, Age, Contact Numbers, and Passport details;
  - b. Name and Address of School in the Philippines and the program enrolled in:
  - Date of arrival, tentative date of departure, and duration of internship in the host country;
  - d. Residential Address/Dormitory and Host Establishment with contact numbers:
  - e. Name and Contact Numbers of the competent coordinator/tutor of FHEs/Os and copy of OJT plan; and
  - f. A copy of the CHED Endorsement.
- 7.2.3 Provide Supervised Applied Learning Experience for student interns in accordance with the agreed Internship Plan, Internship Contract, and schedule of activities:
- 7.2.4 Assign a competent Intern Supervisor/Mentor responsible for the implementation of all phases of the Internship Plan:
- 7.2.5 Assist students who encounter problems during the internship period;
- 7.2.6 Provide evaluation/performance feedback/exit evaluation;
- 7.2.7 Assist students for departure upon completion of the training or premature termination;
- 7.2.8 Issue Certificate of Completion of Internship to the student interns after completion of the program;
- 7.2.9 Submit a written report within five (5) working days to the FSP after the completion of the authorized period of stay of the student interns, for information and/or notation. The report should contain among others the following:
  - Name of student interns who completed the SIAP;
  - Name of student interns who have not completed the SIAP and reason/s for non-completion, if any; and
  - c. Departure details.
- 7.2.10 Ensure that Section 10 provisions shall be covered under the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) for the parties involved.

#### 7.3 Student Interns

7.3.1 Sign and comply with the provisions of the internship contract, including the rules and regulations of the CHED, the HEI, and FHE/O:

- 7.3.2 Undergo the required orientation internship program and/or disaster risk training management conducted by the HEI and FHE/O:
- 7.3.3 Keep a bi-monthly journal of internship/OJT/practicum experiences describing his/her internship activities, problem/s encountered, and reflections on the internship experience to be submitted on a monthly basis to the faculty member or any authorized Coordinator;
- 7.3.4 Complete the agreed duration of his/her internship;
- 7.3.5 Submit to the HEI the terminal report and other school requirements upon completion of the internship; and
- 7.3.6 Report to CHED through the concerned CHEDROs any complaints or grievances, copy furnished their HEIs.

### 7.4 Parent/Legal Guardian or Spouse

- 7.4.1 Co-sign the Internship Contract to manifest consent if student intern is a child, or support, if student intern is a spouse; and
- 7.4.2 Attend the pre-departure seminar or orientation together with the student intern.

## 7.5 Commission on Higher Education (CHED)

## 7.5.1 CHED Regional Offices (CHEDROs)

- a. Receive requests from HEIs;
- Review/evaluate the documentary requirements pre-screened by their respective HEI;
- Prepare endorsement of the list of student interns to the Executive Director through the OSDS;
- d. Ensure that all HEIs and their duly designated internship partners comply with the provisions of this CMO for the welfare and protection of student interns;
- e. Join in the conduct of the monitoring and evaluation; and
- Provide dedicated email or channel for student intern's report of any complaint or grievances.

#### 7.5.2 Office of Student Development and Services (OSDS)

- Receives and evaluates requests of HEIs through CHEDRO's endorsement;
- Prepares evaluation report and recommendation to the Executive Director for the approval/signature of the CHED Chairman;
- c. Establishes and maintains linkages with government and nongovernment agencies and organizations and enter into agreements with them for the successful implementation of SIAP;
- d. Ensures that all HEIs and their duly designated internship partners comply with the provisions of this CMO for the welfare and protection of students;



- e. Prepares the endorsement of the list of student interns to the Bureau of Immigration (BI), copy furnished to the Department of Foreign Affairs; and
- f. Coordinates with the BI on whether the student interns are not included in the Bureau's Hold Departure List and Watchlist. Verification should be made at least three (3) days before the student's departure.

## 7.5.3 The CHED Chairman

Upon compliance, CHED Chairman will endorse the list of students with basic information to the BI, copy furnished the Department of Foreign Affairs – Office of the Undersecretary for Migrant Workers' Affairs (DFA-OUMWA).

## 7.5.4 International Affairs Service (IAS)

IAS seeks opportunities to broaden the implementation of SIAP by facilitating linkages and networking with other countries in coordination with the DFA and other government agencies.

## 7.5.5 Legal and Legislative Service (LLS)

LLS conducts investigations in coordination with concerned offices and submits reports on alleged violations committed by any of the parties to the Commission en Banc for appropriate action.

#### Section 8. Application and Requirements to Participate in SIAP

### 8.1 HEI's Application to Participate in SIAP5

All HEIs, public or private, intending to participate in SIAP shall inform the Commission at least one (1) semester prior to the intended deployment of students. The documents must be submitted to the Commission, through the CHEDROs concerned, in the following order:<sup>6</sup>

- 8.1.1 Duly notarized letter of intent signed by the President/Head of the institution informing the Commission of its intention to participate in the SIAP:
- 8.1.2 Copies of the following duly certified by the Dean of the concerned program:
  - a. Government Recognition (GR)/Certificate of Program Compliance (COPC);
  - Valid Accreditation Certificate of at least Level II Accreditation status of the program awarded by local accrediting bodies; or at least Level 1 but with Level II Accreditation status in the allied programs of the same cluster of discipline;
  - c. Latest CHED approved/acknowledged curriculum;

- d. Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between HEI and FHE/O indicating their specific obligations/responsibilities. The provisions provided per Section 10 must be included in the MOA including a provision that the HEI will assume full responsibility over the students under the internship abroad program, among others;
- e. For State Universities and Colleges (SUCs), a copy of the Board Resolution or Excerpts of the Meeting indicating the Board of Regent's approval of the MOA entered into by and between concerned SUCs and FHEs/Os and list of students to be deployed for internship abroad program;
- f. Original affidavit of FHE/O with regard to its registration in the host country, either:
  - f.1 Duly notarized by the FSP (Philippine embassy/ Consulate/Honorary Consulate authorized to perform notarization service); or
  - f.2 If the affidavit is notarized by a local notary public in the host country, the same must be duly authenticated by the FSP (for non-Apostille countries) or apostilled by the Apostille authority in the country of destination (for Apostille countries).
- g. Proof of conduct of initial visit/inspection of HEIs' partner FHEs/Os such as report or certification and pictures;
- h. Internship Plan with sample Internship Contract; and
- i. Contingency Plan.

## 8.2 HEI's Application for CHED Endorsement to BI7

- 8.2.1 The following documents<sup>8</sup> must be submitted to the Commission, through the CHEDROs concerned, one (1) month prior to the schedule of departure, in the following order:
  - a. Endorsement Letter from the concerned CHEDRO (original);
  - b. Duly notarized Application Letter signed by the President/Head of the institution together with the list of students who will undergo the SIAP;
  - c. Certified true copies of the following documents:
    - c.1 Round-trip e-ticket consistent with the duration of the internship abroad program;
    - c.2 Comprehensive Insurance Policy covering the whole duration of the internship period, including the day of departure, to the arrival of the student intern in the Philippines. The travel, and health and medical insurance shall contain the following coverages:
      - i. Hospitalization benefits or occurrence of symptoms for COVID and other similar health emergencies;
      - ii. Emergency evacuation expenses;

- iii. Repatriation expenses; and
- iv. Travel expenses but not limited to rebooking fee, missed or cancelled flights, and/or additional cost of travel, if applicable.

In case of group insurance, the comprehensive insurance policy must be submitted together with the list of students covered. In case the list of students is an annex to the said comprehensive insurance policy, the said list must be duly certified by the Dean of the program.

- c.3 FHEs/Os Directory containing the list of departing student interns with the following information: name of dormitory/ hotel/place of stay and its address and contact number/s; and
- c.4 Proof of conduct of general orientation and pre-departure briefing for qualified student interns in the presence of their parents/legal guardians/spouse such as attendance and pictures.
- d. Individual SIAP Documentary Requirements of Student Intern:
  - d.1 Passport bio page with signature (photocopy);
  - d.2 Appropriate Visa issued by the host country (photocopy);
  - d.3 COVID-19 Vaccination Certificate, if applicable;
  - d.4 Medical Certificate/s indicating that the student is physically, mentally, and emotionally fit as certified by the DOH accredited clinics or hospitals (original);
  - d.5 Transcript of Records (TOR) with Seal (original);
  - d.6 Certification signed by the school registrar that the student is currently enrolled in the internship/OJT/practicum subject and has completed at least 75% of professional units or 4th year or graduating student (original);
  - d.7 Duly notarized affidavit of consent from parents/legal guardians/spouse or co-sign the internship contract/ agreement (original); and
  - d.8 Other supporting documentary requirements of the accepting country of destination, if applicable.

#### 8.3 Timelines

CHED evaluates the completeness and compliance of the documents submitted by HEI.

8.3.1 Only SIAP applications with complete requirements shall be processed by the concerned CHEDRO and forwarded to the OSDS:

Upon compliance, CHED shall prepare the endorsement for BI clearance to be signed by the Chairman copy furnished to the DFA-OUMWA, and concerned CHEDRO. Only HEI authorized liaison personnel will be allowed to transact with CHED.

## Section 9. Fees and Charges

The HEIs may charge additional fees in consultation with students and their parents or legal guardians.

In no case shall there be any placement or recruitment and any other fees to be collected from the student and/or their parents/legal guardians other than those approved/prescribed fees duly noted by CHED.

Fees and Charges for this purpose are held in trust by the HEI to undertake specific activities for the development and implementation of the International Practicum Program such as monitoring, international linkage, and networking.

## Section 10. Memorandum of Agreement (MOA)9 for the Parties Involved

The MOA shall be duly executed and notarized between HEI and FHE/O which shall clearly state and provide, among others the following:

10.1 Duration of the internship program should not be less than three (3) months but not more than twelve (12) months as dictated by program requirements, and the extension on the duration of the international internship is not allowed or prohibited.

In the case of the Medical program, the required international internship of less than 3 months may be allowed;

- 10.2 Roundtrip ticket of the student interns;
- 10.3 Monthly allowance based on prevailing living standards of the host country;

- 10.4 Compensatory overtime/excess allowance or other applicable schemes per existing law of the host country when performing internship duties on a holiday (for a maximum of four hours) in excess of the regular eight hours with due consideration to the health and safety of the interns:
- 10.5 Duty meals and uniform for the student intern:
- 10.6 Decent and habitable dormitories with the following features:
  - a. accessible to the workplace;
  - b. comfortable bedrooms that provide privacy for students;
  - c. separate dormitories for male and female student interns, if possible;
  - d. acceptable kitchen, laundry, receiving, dining, toilet, storage/cabinet facilities;
  - e. adequate supply of water and electricity:
  - f. must provide a locker that is secured or safety deposit box; and
  - g. extra charges in excess of the usage of basic utilities (e.g. electricity or water) must be stated in the training contract.
- 10.7 Death, accident, and dismemberment insurance coverage;
- 10.8 Emergency evacuation and repatriation expenses and cost in case of death or a free return ticket if the student intern was physically incapacitated;
- 10.9 Hospitalization benefits or occurrence of symptoms for COVID and other similar health emergencies; and
- 10.10 Travel expenses but not limited to rebooking fee, missed or cancelled flights, and/or additional cost of travel, if applicable.

## Section 11. Departure Protocol/Formalities

In addition to primary travel documents, student interns shall present the following documents to the BI Officer:

- 11.1 CHED Endorsement to the BI; and
- 11.2 Round trip ticket consistent with the duration of the internship program.

#### Section 12. Monitoring and Evaluation

- 12.1 The monitoring and evaluation of the performance of the student interns shall be done jointly by the HEIs and the FHEs/Os, using standard procedures, instruments, and methodologies such as observations, monthly reports, and interviews or conferences with the concerned students;
- 12.2 At the end of the internship period, the FHEs/Os shall transmit to the HEI the following documents:
  - a. Certificate of Completion;
  - b. Duly accomplished evaluation sheet; and
  - Other pertinent reports, information, and/or documents that may be required.
- 12.3 The faculty member or any authorized Coordinator report will be the basis for giving the student's final grade by the HEI;



- 12.4 A student whose contract was terminated due to resignation or other cause shall be given a final grade based on school's grading system after considering the circumstances surrounding such termination;
- 12.5 CHED-OSDS together with the CHEDROs, and members of the TWG/Inter-Agency Committee on SIAP shall conduct random validation in case there are reports of irregularities regarding SIAP. All expenses to be incurred for this purpose shall be charged to the OSDS funds subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations; and
- 12.6 A monitoring tool shall be developed to ensure compliance of all parties concerned to the provisions of this CMO.

#### Section 13. Establishment of E-Portal

The student interns or the FHEs/Os shall provide information/details required under the established E-Portal on the registration and exit clearance and necessary information from the host country. The E-Portal shall enable the student interns, HEIs and CHED to submit and transmit public documents electronically.

The Commission shall provide the DFA through the concerned Philippine Embassy abroad an access on the details of registration and exit clearance from the host country of student interns as CHED mechanism to monitor their arrival and departure from the host country in relation to their international internship, in congruence to the provisions of National Privacy Circular (NPC) No. 2020-03 dated 23 December 2020 the "Data Sharing Agreement".

#### Section 14. Offenses

#### 14.1 Violations by the Higher Education Institutions

Any HEI that shall be found to have committed the following violations of this CMO shall be meted with the appropriate sanctions stated in Section 15:

- 14.1.1 Allowing student interns to undertake SIAP without securing a valid endorsement from CHED to BI;
- 14.1.2 Submission of fake documents;
- 14.1.3 Committing of acts of trafficking in persons, illegal recruitment, or misrepresentation such as but not limited to: deployment of SIAP participants to foreign households as domestic workers, manpower pooling; enticing students to participate in the program by advertising such as a pathway to overseas employment and other acts similar or analogous to the foregoing;
- 14.1.4 Failure to monitor the welfare of student interns;
- 14.1.5 Allowing student interns to receive allowances lower than the prevailing living standards of the host country;
- 14.1.6 Making false statements /mis-statement of student records/documents to make it appear that the student is



- qualified to undertake SIAP; such as presenting their graduates as undergraduate students undertaking internship/OJT/practicum;
- 14.1.7 Failure to conduct pre-departure orientation for student interns and parents/legal guardians/spouse;
- 14.1.8 Failure to submit the required reports/documents such as: a. Internship Contract;
  - b. Copy of Notarized MOA with FHEs/Os; and
  - c. Annual Reports on SIAP;
- 14.1.9 Demanding from student interns internship fees or any other charges not included in CMO 03, s. 2012 and other similar CHED issuances:
- 14.1.10 Failure to submit the required Annual Report; and
- 14.1.11 Such other acts similar or analogous to the foregoing and activities classified as human trafficking under R.A. 9208 and such other similar issuances that is in violation of the provisions herein.

## 14.2 Grounds for Blacklisting Foreign Host Establishments or Organizations (FHEs/Os)

The following are the grounds for blacklisting of FHEs/Os:

- 14.2.1 Violation of any of the provisions of the MOA and this CMO;
- 14.2.2 Changing provisions of signed Internship Contract without the consent of the student interns and HEI;
- 14.2.3 Non-compliance with prescribed Internship Plan;
- 14.2.4 Giving student interns allowances lower than the prevailing living standards of the host country;
- 14.2.5 Withholding the allowances and internship/OJT/practicum reports of student interns without just cause;
- 14.2.6 Overcharging and making illegal deductions from student interns' allowances without just cause;
- 14.2.7 Placing student interns in prohibited internship venues;
- 14.2.8 Allowing Filipino student interns to go abroad without passing CHED:
- 14.2.9 Accepting workers in the guise of student interns; and
- 14.2.10 Such other acts similar or analogous to the foregoing and activities classified as human trafficking under R.A. 9208 and such other similar issuances that are in violation of the provisions herein.

#### 14.3 Violation of Student Interns

- 14.3.1 Any act in violation of HEI's rules and regulations;
- 14.3.2 Any act in violation of FHEs/Os rules and regulations in accordance with the internship program;
- 14.3.3 Any act in violation of the laws of the host country; and
- 14.3.4 Extension of international internship beyond the allowable period of internship dictated by the program.



#### Section 15. Sanctions

- 15.1 Any HEI found guilty of violating any of the provisions contained under Section 14 of this CMO may be subjected to sanctions by the Commission, upon the recommendation of the CHED Legal and Legislative Service, depending on the gravity of the violation taking into consideration the following:
  - 15.1.1 Number of students affected:
  - 15.1.2 Adverse consequences resulting from the violation;
  - 15.1.3 Damage to the reputation of the Philippine higher education; and
  - 15.1.4 Brazenness of the violation.
- 15.2 Any HEI found guilty of violating any of the provisions contained under Section 14 of this CMO may be subjected to the following sanctions:
  - 15.2.1 Written reprimand, with a warning that repeated or persistent violations of these regulations and guidelines, may result in the suspension or revocation of the HEI's participation in the SIAP;
  - 15.2.2 Suspension from participating in the SIAP for a period of time determined by the Commission en Banc upon the determination of a repeated violation of this CMO;
  - 15.2.3 Downgrading of Government Recognition to permit status, from COE to COD, from Autonomous to Deregulated, or downgrading of SUC Level status;
  - 15.2.4 Revocation of program/institutional recognition (COEs, and CODs, Autonomous, Deregulated, and SUC Level);
  - 15.2.5 Filing of the appropriate administrative and criminal case and/or prosecution of criminal action as appropriate; and
  - 15.2.6 Imposition of administrative fine of not less than P100,000.00 but not more than P2,000,000.00.
- 15.3 Any student intern found guilty of violating any of the provisions contained under Section 14 of this CMO may be subjected to sanctions in accordance with the concerned HEI's rules and regulations.

### Section 16. Investigation of Complaints

- 16.1 Upon receipt by CHEDROs/OSDS CHED Central Office of complaints or reports on alleged student exploitation and abovementioned violations, the same shall be immediately referred to the CHED Chairman through the Executive Director who shall order the Legal and Legislative Service and other concerned offices to conduct an investigation on complaints/reports for appropriate action, following prescribed procedures instituted by the same;
- 16.2 HEI and/or FHE/O while under investigation for alleged violations of this CMO may be suspended from participating in the SIAP by the CHED Chairman; and



16.3 CHED shall immediately furnish the IACAT and the concerned POEA/DMW Anti-Illegal Recruitment Unit, upon receipt of a copy of complaints on reports for appropriate action.

### Article VI REPEALING CLAUSE

Section 17. All previous issuances contrary to this CMO including CMO No. 22, s. 2013, Revised Policies, Standards and Guidelines (PSGs) on Student Internship Abroad Program (SIAP) are hereby deemed, repealed and revoked.

## Article VII EFFECTIVITY

Section 18. This CMO shall take effect fifteen (15) days after publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of national circulation. This CMO shall be implemented beginning 1st semester of Academic Year (AY) 2023-2024.

This CMO shall be registered with the Office of the National Administrative Register at the University of the Philippines Law Center, UP Diliman, Quezon City.

### **GUIDE ON INTERNSHIP PLAN**

Internship plan includes among others, the description of the following:

#### I. INTRODUCTION:

During the internship program, the student interns are assigned to different areas and venues, while in the Foreign Host Establishments/Organizations (FHEs/Os), the student interns are given actual work experience in various departments that may be determined and mutually agreed upon by the school. FHE/Os or the student intern

The curriculum is designed in a way that the students acquire practical knowledge, basic concept, skills, and work values in recognized FHEs/Os in host countries

#### II. GOALS/OBJECTIVES:

The exposure to different work situations is provided to enable the student intern to experience and observe the practical application of theories learned in school.

At the end of the internship program, the student intern should be able to:

- Identify key positions in the industry and related operations to their corresponding tasks and responsibilities;
- 2. Define the standard operational procedure in each of the departments assigned:
- 3. Identify and operate the equipment, facilities, and layout design in each of the departments assigned;
- Perform required skills and techniques necessary in the execution of operational procedures of the assigned tasks in accordance with the existing workplace, health and safety standards; and
- Analyze and evaluate operational procedures in each assigned task and recommend any appropriate course of action to be taken to improve procedures.



#### III. REQUIREMENTS OF THE PROGRAM:

#### A. List of documents for the student internship as stipulated in the CMO

## B. Orientation and Briefing

After the application period, orientation and pre-internship seminars shall be set. Training expectations, guidelines, rules and regulations, and course requirements shall be discussed. An open forum provides a venue for clarification on certain issues. The speakers from the FHEs/Os may be invited to share their insights, expectations, and experiences.

### C. Internship Contract

An internship contract is signed by the student intern, the Higher Education Institution (HEI), and the FHE/O. This agreement identifies the student intern's tasks and some policies regarding the program.

#### D. Performance

The culmination of the internship program is the evaluation of the student intern's performance. The evaluation should contain the following:

#### E. Certification

A certification with the logo by the FHEs/Os is issued to student interns after the completion of the designated number of hours. The certification bears the seal, signed by the FHEs/Os authorized representative.





- 3 Financial obligations of each party, if applicable
- 4 Key contacts for each party involved

#### II. DEFINITION OF TERMS, IF APPLICABLE

#### III. DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

This section identifies the mutual and joint responsibilities (collaborative tasks) and the expected result of those joint efforts. In addition, it lists the specific roles and responsibilities of each entity and clarifies the purpose of the MOA as stipulated in the CMO.

#### IV. EVENTS OF DEFAULT

The grounds for blacklisting of Foreign Host Establishments or Organizations and any HEIs found to have committed the violations of the guidelines shall be meted with the appropriate sanctions stated in the CMO

#### V. EXCLUSION OF PARTNERSHIP

The parties hereto expressly agree that nothing contained or implied in the AGREEMENT shall constitute a partnership or joint venture within the parties hereto or any of them do not constitute nor be deemed to constitute any Party as an affiliate to any Party for any purpose whatsoever.

### VI. NOTICES AND GENERAL MATTERS

Notices under the AGREEMENT may be delivered by hand, or email, or by registered mail to the addresses specified.

#### VII. REMEDIES

No remedy confirmed by any of the provisions of the AGREEMENT is intended to be excluded of any other remedy which is otherwise available by law, equity statute or otherwise and each and any other remedy shall be cumulative and shall be in addition to every other remedy given hereunder or not hereafter existing by law, equity, statute or otherwise.

#### VIII. SEVERANCE

If any provision of the AGREEMENT or part thereof is rendered void, illegal or unenforceable by any legislation to which it is subject, it shall be rendered void, illegal or not enforceable only to that extent and no further.



#### IX. CONFIDENTIALITY

The AGREEMENT, as well as its terms and conditions herein, shall be held in strict confidence and that no portion or part hereof may be reproduced or be revealed to any personnel or entity other that the signatories herein or their authorized representative.

#### X. SEPARABILITY

The invalidity or unenforceability of any provision of the AGREEMENT shall not affect or impair other provisions that are otherwise valid, binding and effective.

#### XI. GOVERNING LAW AND ARBITRATION

The AGREEMENT shall be governed by and construed according to the laws of the Republic of the Philippines.

#### XII. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

The AGREEMENT constitutes the entire agreement between the parties, their successors and assignees. Any and all matters or things that the parties may have agreed, but have not reduced in writing herein, shall be void and ineffective.

#### XIII. DURATION

This segment identifies the effective date of the AGREEMENT, its term (if there is one), and how the agreement can be modified or terminated.

#### XIV. SIGNATURES OF PARTIES' PRINCIPALS

Finally, to demonstrate agreement with the terms of the MOA, spaces are provided for the names and signatures of an official from each party who is authorized to approve agreements on the party's behalf. A space for the date the agreement was signed is also required. The MOA is not in effect until all parties have signed the MOA. Each party should then be provided with a signed original, duly notarized and authenticated before the concerned Philippine Foreign Service Post.
