(PLAI), in partnership with the National Commission for Culture and the Arts (NCCA) through the National Committee on Library and Information Services (NCLIS), the National Library of the Philippines (NLP), and University of the Assumption will be conducting the PLAI Centennial National Congress on 21-24 November 2023 at the SMX Convention Center, Clark Field, Pampanga.

- 7. Foster a culture of collaboration among librarians, researchers, educators, and other stakeholders to share experiences, challenges, and successes in the field.
- 8. Promote inclusivity and diversity in library services and collections, addressing issues of accessibility, representation, and cultural sensitivity.
- 9. Identify strategies to engage and empower marginalized communities through library initiatives and outreach programs.



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There will be plenary sessions and parallel sessions sponsored by sectoral library associations to discuss topics relevant to the different types of libraries (i.e., academic, public, school, and special). Moreover, the General Assembly will be held to present updates and provide a venue for discussion of concerns relating to the Association and to the profession in general.

As the host of this year's Congress, the Central Luzon Region Librarians Council (CeLRLC), in collaboration with the University of the Assumption, would like to request your Office's endorsement of this activity so that HEI administrators in Region II may encourage their librarians, teacher-librarians, and library personnel to attend.
